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Week 1 June 14-18

Steam Camp—Creative Building Grades Entering Pre-Kindergarten-1

Campers will complete daily building challenges using a variety of building materials including LEGOs, K'Nex, and Zometools in our Innovation Lab.



Week 2 June 21-25

Steam Camp—Rube Goldberg Machines

Grades Entering 1-8

Campers will explore classic Rube Goldberg cartoons and machines to learn about the different types of simple machines used in them. Campers will then have fun creating a Rube Goldberg machine based on the national Rube Goldberg 2021 Machine Challenge to turn and shake a box of Nerds candy.

Week 3 June 28-July 2

Flag Football

Grades Entering 3-8

The Holy Child flag football program is for your young athletes who want an introduction to football or for those who simply want to brush up on their skills in preparation for league play. Our programs maximize the fun by including an exciting mix of instruction, drills, and games. The themes of this camp are sportsmanship, perseverance and leadership. There will also be a section each day on the rules and history of the sport. The week ends with the Holy Child Bowl, giving participants a chance to showcase the skills they have learned on the gridiron!



Week 4 July 5-9

Steam Camp—Board Game Design

Grades Entering 1-8

Campers will learn about the different types of board games through playing different games and learning about the history of games. They explore the types of strategies used in games. They will then design their own game using digital graphic software and engineering materials. They will create their own game pieces and print their own boards.

Week 8 August 2-6

Sports Concepts & Strategies through Technology

Grades Entering 3-8

Does your child enjoy soccer or football?
Do they want to improve their skills?

This camp will utilize technology and coaching to do just that! Our coaches will teach them how to become a better player using FIFA and Madden to learn the strategy of the game while having fun. The camp will focus on play calling and strategy while using stats to better understand what is working and what needs to be improved. During the afternoon session the coaches will reinforce the lessons learned through technology and help them compete at a higher level on the field of play. We will have fun competitions throughout the week culminating in an end of week tournament.
